UIC: Comprehensive Research Univ

- 16,660 undergraduate students
- 8,200 graduate and 2,750 professional students
- 15 academic colleges, 240 degree programs
- 2,550 faculty; 8,000 staff
- \$335M in research expenditures annually
- 110 buildings, 240 acres (plus a Prairie)
- Comprehensive campuses in Peoria and Rockford
- US News #9 for on-line undergraduate degrees
- Times #19 globally; #4 nationally for universities under 50
- 20 Division 1 (NCAA) sports teams

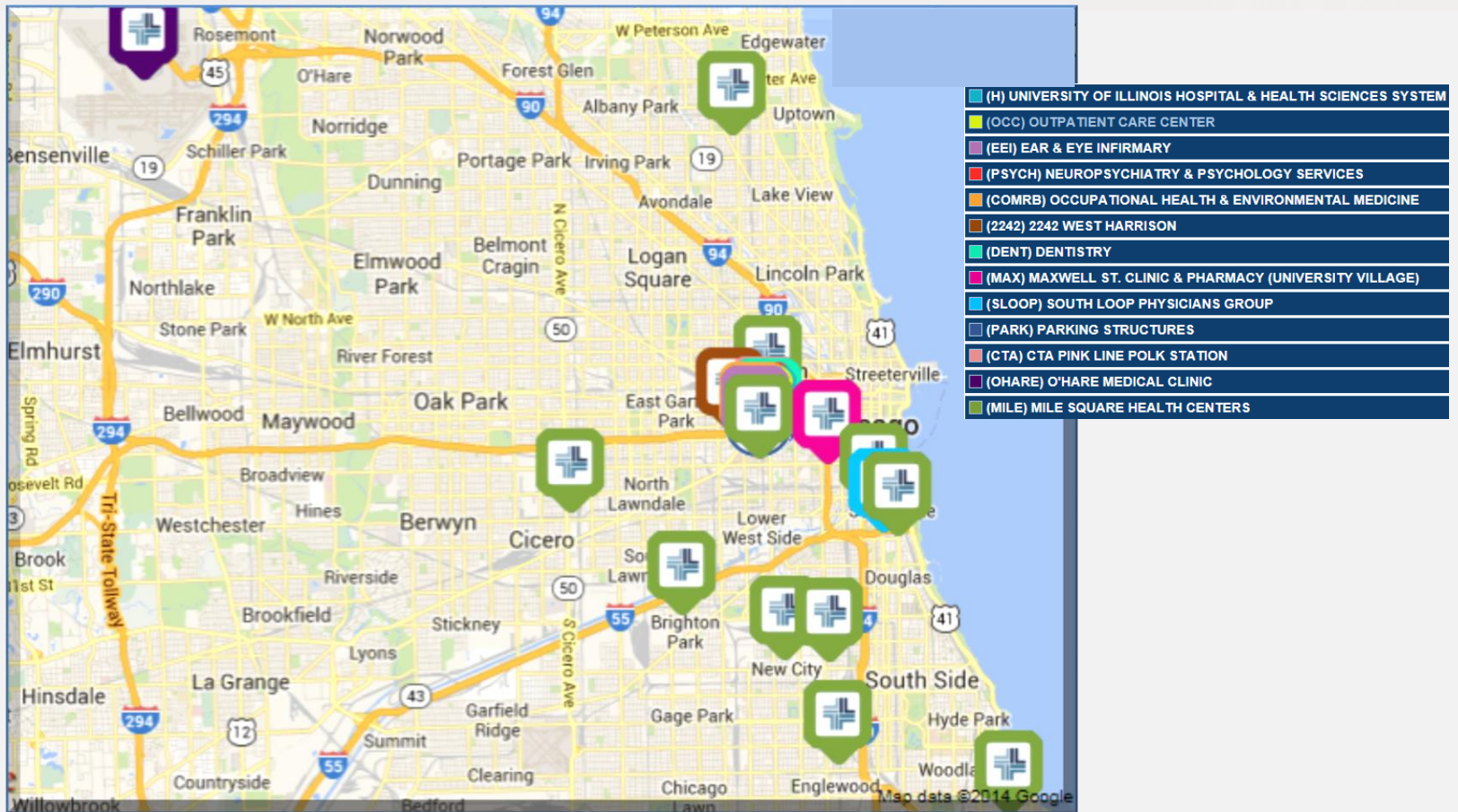

UIC is Chicago

- \$2.5 billion operating budget – spent in Chicago
- \$562 million federal dollars to Illinois – into Chicago
- Chicago's 15th largest employer
- 1 in 10 college grads is a UIC alum
- 1 in 7 physicians is a UIC alum
- 31% of students are from Chicago
- 39% of graduates stay in Chicago – Cook County

- New Vice Chancellor

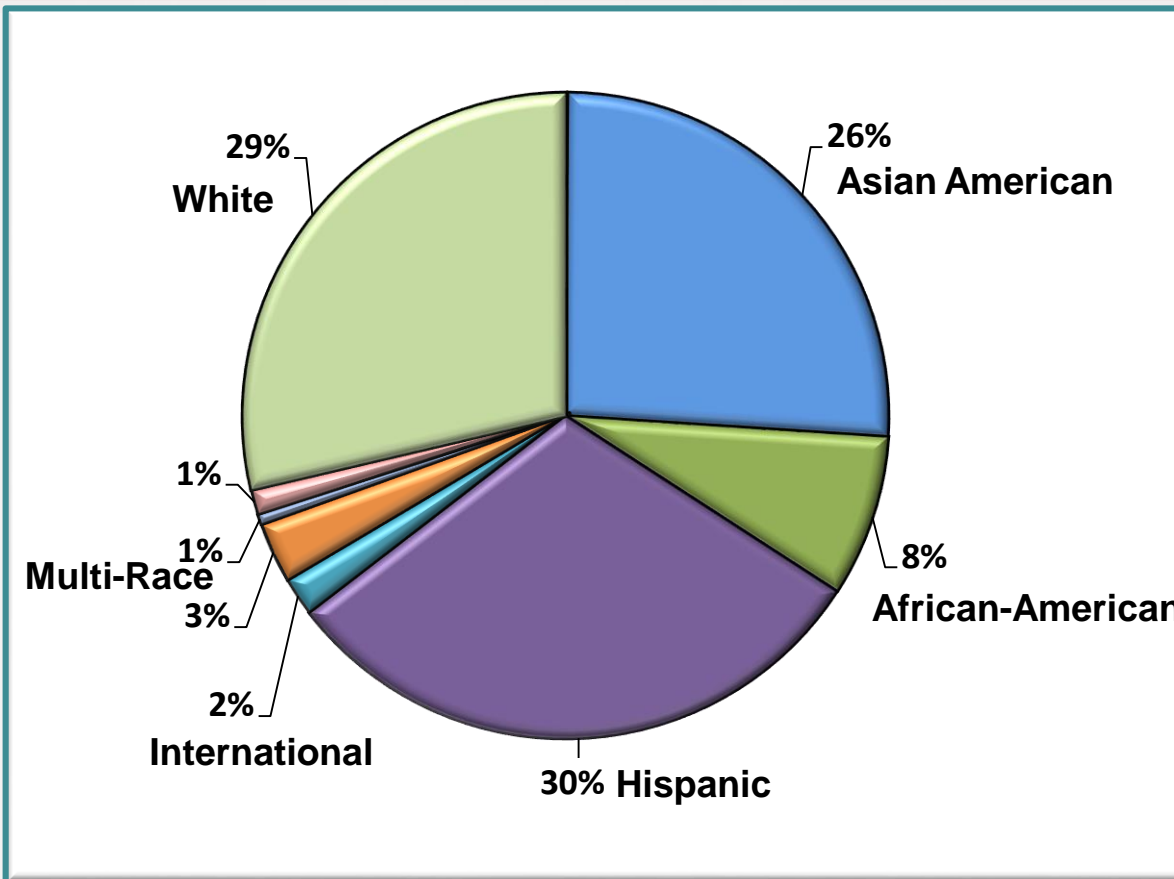
UIC: Capital Investments

- Renovated 18 classrooms, two with Technology Enhanced Active Learning Studios (TEALS)
- Began improving appearance of first-floor common areas of campus buildings
- Energy Performance Contract (ESCO; \$65 M)
- College of Dentistry modernization (\$20.8 M)
- College of Medicine Learning Center (\$15 M)
- SEL Infrastructure Renovations (\$11.7 M)
- Lecture Center A Renovations (\$6.2 M)
- Miscellaneous R&R projects totaling \$47 M
- SEO Memorial Grove
- Hospital bond – improvement (75 M)

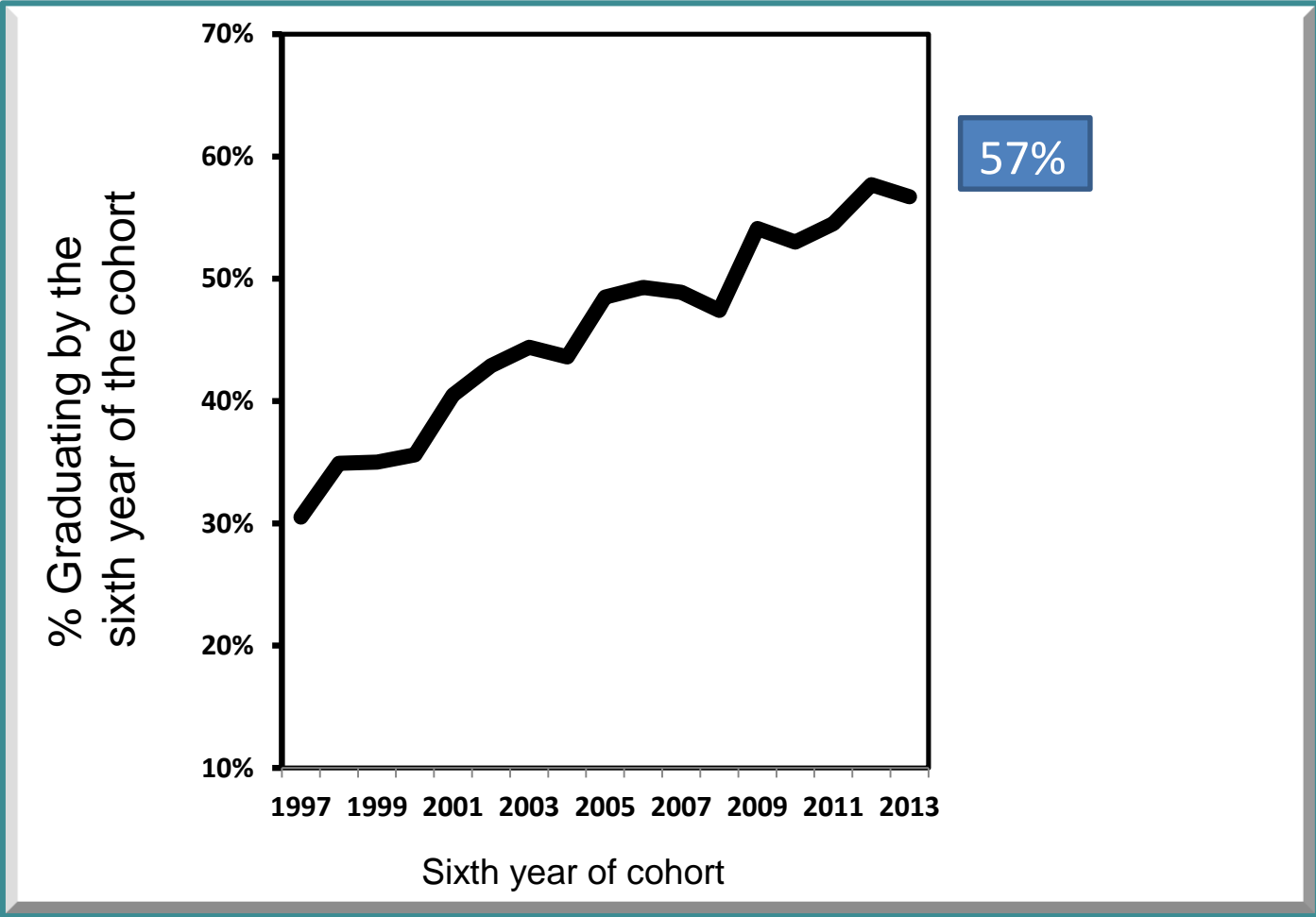
